## Pastoral Summary Impact

As Pastor, I continue to provide guidance, insight, and inspiration through leadership, spiritually, pastoral support. This report does not include the one-on-ones, pastoral visitations, hospital/nursing care facilities, phone calls and support.

The following is a synopsis of the accomplishments and impact:

- Sunday School and Bible Study Spiritual Renewal was conducted weekly every Sunday at 9:30am for adult. A Children and youth Bible study was started in July 2024 at 9:30am every Sunday. It has been well attended. On Wednesday at 11:00am and 7:00pm adult Bible Study and Spiritual Renewal. Our theme for the Bible Study has been: Moving Forward with Jesus Empowerment Series. The attendance has increase from 5 to 13 in attendance with a goal of getting as many as possible into studies.
- Baptism – There were a total of eleven baptism of first-time believer. Each of these received new discipleship training and was fellowship into the church.
- Discipleship/Membership – There were a total of thirty-eight disciples that joined or reinstated during the period December 1,2023 -November 30, 2024. Even though some joined after those dates and will be reflected in the 2024 Quarter 1 report.
- Christening – There were one Christening – The Freeland – 09/15/2024.
- Wedding – There was one wedding- The Bolts-Hemion – 11-28-2024.
- Sunday Worship Attendance – The Usher ministry has been instrumental in keeping track of numbers starting in November – 2024:
  - November 14 - 84
  - November 10 – 60
  - November 17 – 70
  - November 24 – 68
  - December 1 – 61
  - December 8 -97

These numbers do not include on-line viewership which ranged from a low of 184 to a high of 284. Online viewership has been impacted by technology challenges. God continue to add to the church and these number will be reflective of the impact as we track for the year and allows for an opportunity to discern grown opportunities.

- **Deceased** - There were a total of five (5) Beloved congregnts that transitioned as reflected in the Clerk report of which I provided both pastoral counseling and bereavement support with these families. Other bereavements and support for families included (Delois Gillis; Carl Vinson; Vera Patterson; Richard Simmons and Stanley Gordon, James Dupree)
- **Sick and Shut-In Ministry** – Mother Mable Jones; Michael Thomas; Mother Marie Wallace; Mother Gloria Yuman; Brother Ed Taylor; Mother Prince Smith, Mother Joanne Matthew; Sister Betty Martin.
- **Community and Congregational Worship Ministries and Events** –

- Christmas Youth Ministry – December 24, 2023, was amazing to see our young people grow in the Love of God and thrive. There were nearly fifty young people who participated.
- Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day – January 14, 2024. Attorney Craig Smith was our Keynote speaker with a theme of: “A House Divided against itself will not stand.” It was inspiring and well attended by the community with one hundred in attendance. Funds received from this event were earmarked for the Social Justice ministry. The amount collected should be reflected in the Trustee financial report.
- Ash Wednesday Service -February 14, 2024 – The Church was invited to fellowship with St. Matthews Lutheran Church for this service. The Church responded – Deacons participated in the worship, choir sang, and I was part of the worship liturgy bring a short message. Thank you to those who accompanied me to the worship services. At midday Deacon Carla Bunn and I participated in the imposition of ashes at MLK, and twelve (12) individuals stopped by for service.
- **Grief Healing Circles** were held on May 15 and May 20, 2024, in-person.
- Summer feeding program in partnership with Renton schools and the City of Renton has been in operation for its second year. It ran from July 8-August 9, 2024 Thanks to Sister Leslie for taking on this ministry and organizing for the community. Thanks to all the Volunteers.
- American for Equality Technical Program was offered to all at our Church. It is in full operation. To date we have been able to recruit fourteen individuals for the program. While there are still some issues to be resolve it is a great program and will be beneficial for those who are fully participating. Recruitment is still active and ongoing.
- Spiritual Olympia – July 26 – August 11- Sister Leslie Turner lead the Spiritual Olympia for the church that was instrumental in getting the congregation involved. There were many new relationships developed but one of the most powerful impacts was in bible studies on Sunday’s.
- United Usher Day at People Institutional Baptist Church Day – June 23, 2024 – The Church was part of United Usher Annual day held at People Institutional Church- Pastor Linda preached the sermon, Choir sung, congregants attended, and the Usher provided the usher ministry for that day. The Pastor stated that was the largest number of participants their church for many years. Thanks to Sister Renee Wells for a job well done in stepping us and providing leadership for the usher ministry with the amazing support of Sister Teresa Bartholemew for getting us reinstated back to the United Usher Christian Conference.
- Vacation Bible School – July 31- August 2, 2024. The Vacation was well attended especially with young people and youth.
- Installation of Pastor Linda – September 22, 2024 – Thanks to the Diaconate ministry for their leadership of an amazing celebration. There were over two hundred in attendance and 337 viewers. It was a beautiful and momentum worship event. Over \$800 was received and was designed for our Building for the future stewardship fund. Thank you and the community for an extraordinary experience.

- Leadership Retreat – October 12, 2024, was held for all ministry leaders, elected leaders, deacons, trustees, ministers, and committee chairpersons. It was held at the Institute for Community Development. There were twenty-six in attendance. The information collected from the reflection has and is being integrated into the goals and ways we move forward in 2024.
- Teachers Training- October 22, 2024 -Training for teachers was conducted for all teachers, both new and returning teachers. There were twelve in attendance. The training was conducted both in-person and virtual.
- All Church Prayer – November 13, 2024 – Approximately 15 people were in person and virtual.
- Fall Spiritual Revival – November 14-15, 2024. The theme of the Revival is also our Church Theme for 2024- Revive: Moving Forward-Rising in Divine Glory. The Revival theme was living from Abundance not scarcity as we abide in the Vine of Jesus.
- Music Ministry – Voices of Praise conducted their Annual Celebration on Sunday, November 18, 2024, during the 11:00am worship service. Wonderful service.
  - Brandon Young has also been hired as the Minister of Music as Dayniel Damon resigned. We were grateful for Mr. Damon service and the level of excellence he brought to our very inspiring Music Ministry. As we continue to build the music ministry, we must also rise to a new level with the Music ministry that you will note in the action items for this upcoming year.
- Thanksgiving Service – November 28,2024 was held virtual and in person for the first time since 2020. It was a powerful service with testimonies from those in attendance. Rev Lyndon Mckinney preached the Message.
- **Capital Campaign and Stewardship Strategic and Engagement Plan** – This is what guides the work in the upcoming years to continue rise to a new level of excellence. A team worked for half of the year producing ideas and framing what a new building and ministry structure look like. We have added additional team members representative of diverse age groups. We will resume this work again in January 2025. (see Plan)
- **Finance**
  - Thanks to the Trustee’s for the work that they have done this year. I have had several meeting with the Trustee department as we strategize in moving the church forward. The plan is the foundation of the work we are embracing on for the future. The Trustees will move the funds arounds to the various funds to ensure that we are building a strong financial profilio for the future so when we move into the next phase of building and expansion, we will have diversified financial resource from which to draw funds. As we move into this upcoming year, we must be more focused strategically on how we support the financial aspect of the church including Tithles and offerings as we each make a commitment for the upcoming year.

## Next Steps: Plan of Action Items for 2025

- Focus attention on Building the Church for the future that include temporary space to accommodate the growing ministry.
- Create more focused Children, Youth ministry. As noted in the ministry report we will continue to work to enhance and create life changing ministries for this age group.
- Continue to assess visitors and determine if there is a reason for no return how we can continue to reach out to them.
- Continue the \$100,000 Strategic Campaign asking every member to donate any amount over and beyond their Tithes and offering. These funds are used to help with repairs and to fund ministries of Youth, Evangelism, and Outreach. We have increased the funds, and you will see in the financial report how the funds continue to help us in achieving short-term goals as well as building for the future.
- Build eLevate – Young Adult ministry Leadership Development and ministry.
- Continue to improve the Music Ministry by budgeting a Choir Director
- Work with Ministry of Music to revive, children-youth, Young Adult and Men Choir. While our goal is not to get all of these integrated this year it is noted as a way of us continue to stay focus.
- Create an all-church prayer ministry team. The prayer team is to focus on praying for the church and world issues. The prayer team does not replace the Deacon Ministry pray that is held weekly.
- Continue to provide leadership training to all elected leaders and ministries leads.
- Review the starting time for worship to start at 10:30am after Easter to give people more time at home.
- Conduct Ministers and Preaching training.
